- Always park at a bike rack.
- **Lock your bike** frame and wheel to a rack.
- Register your bike with the ACPD.
- Always follow marked bike paths and respect the dismount zones.

- Stay awake.
- Travel with a friend.
- Sit near the driver or conductor.
- Keep personal belongings close to you.
- Avoid isolated bus or rail stops.
- Don't tell strangers where you are getting off.
- **Don't flaunt** money, electronics, or jewelry.

- **Trust your instincts.** If you suspect something is wrong, you're probably right. Report it!
- Be aware and prepared. Pay attention to your surroundings and make note of any suspicious activity.
- Use the buddy system. Always walk with a friend at night.
- Call NightRider. Take advantage of the NightRider Service for a safe escort to your vehicle: 303-556-2001. (After 10 p.m., call ACPD: 303-556-5000.)
- Locate Emergency Phones. The Emergency Phones will connect you with the ACPD immediately. The 9' outdoor phones with blue lights on top are in all parking lots and pedestrian areas. Indoor phones are located in common areas.
- Report solicitors. Avoid solicitors' scams by politely saying no and notifying the ACPD of the suspicious activity.
- Lock it. While working late at night or when leaving for the day, lock your office.

- Do not leave computers, backpacks, cell phones or other belongings unattended.
- Always lock your vehicle and office.
- Never leave valuables in sight in your vehicle.
- Park in visible, well-lit, and well-traveled locations.
- Keep personal information private do not share personal details with solicitors.
- Secure personal belongings in a locked office, cabinet, or drawer.
